Professor Andreas Wollenberg

Germany

Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Andreas Wollenberg is head of the Conservative and Pediatric Inpatient Unit, the Atopic Dermatitis Special Clinic, and the Clinical trial Unit of the Department of Dermatology and Allergy, at Ludwig-Maximilian University in Munich, Germany.

Prof. Wollenberg completed his internship and residency in the Department of Dermatology and Allergy at Ludwig-Maximilian University in Munich, where he worked in the laboratory of cutaneous immunobiology. Subsequently, he trained at The Scripps Research Institute, Department of Molecular and Experimental Medicine, in La Jolla, California, USA.

Prof. Wollenberg has conducted his research in the field of atopic dermatitis, experimental dermatology, dendritic cell research, eczema herpeticum, smallpox vaccination, perioral dermatitis and EGFR (epidermal growth factor receptor inhibitor)-induced skin toxicity. His research has generated more than 280 peer-reviewed publications and a Hirsch Index of 61. Currently, he is a member of the editorial board of the Journal of Allergy and reviewer for approximately 20 biomedical journals. Notably, Prof. Wollenberg is the lead author of the European Task Force on Atopic Dermatitis (ETFAD) Position Paper and the European Dermatology Forum (EDF) Guidelines for Atopic Dermatitis.

In honour of his work in dermatology, Prof. Wollenberg has received the Third International Professor Hans Storck Scientific Award, the Karl-Hansen-Prize of the German Society for Allergy and Clinical Immunology and the Fujisawa Young Investigator Achievements in Atopic Dermatitis Award. Moreover, he received a Dr. honoris causa from the Medical University Iuliu Hatieganu in Cluj-Napoca Romania.

Dr Lucinda Tan is a Consultant Dermatologist at the National Skin Centre (NSC), with special interests in Immunodermatology, as well as Medical and Paediatric Dermatology. Dr Tan subsequently completed a post-doctoral fellowship in Immunodermatology and Paediatric Dermatology at the Johns Hopkins Hospital and Children’s Centre in Baltimore, USA. She is currently Head of Pediatric Dermatology in NSC and a visiting consultant to KK Women and Children’s Hospital.

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
