# Message from the **President**

My dear friends,

Time has flown and we are almost at the end of 2022. It seems hard to believe that my time in this presidential role is coming to an end.

Firstly, I would like to express my appreciation to all of you for giving me this opportunity to serve as your president for the last two years. It would be untruthful if I said it has not been a tough two years to hold this role, for so many reasons - the impact of COVID-19 pandemic and personal challenges, but it has also been a very rewarding and humbling experience.

I took over the presidency in September 2020 when we were still in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and two years down the line, we are still trying to win this war. The highlight of my tenure was the 10<sup>th</sup> Regional Scientific Meeting of Paediatric Dermatology. New milestones were reached. The cutting-edge science and knowledge shared at the conference was of the highest standard with prominent international and local speakers. As we moved into an endemic mode, we were able to conduct face-to-face physical meetings. In collaboration with the Dermatology Chapter, we had our first physical Mid-Term Meeting in April this year. This was held at the impressive Auditorium of UITM Hospital, Puncak Alam, Selangor.

Other CME activities that were carried out include a series of excellent academic meetings organised by the Dermatology Chapter. With Dr Henry Foong at the helm, the Dermatology Chapter organised various successful meetings all over Malaysia. Our Northern Region colleagues also held a physical conference; the 9<sup>th</sup> Dermatology Summit in February this year at the G Hotel, Penang which was well attended.

We have also partnered with various companies from the biomedical industry to provide patient-centred educational events for both dermatologists and primary care doctors. These CME activities were carried out both virtually and physically. PDM is also committed to training and research. PDM has fully supported our national training programme in Dermatology, the Advanced Master in Dermatology. We are delighted to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Advanced Master of Dermatology Programme this year. I am proud to be the graduate of the pioneer batch and over the span of 20 years, this programme has produced 91 graduates. I must thank the late Professor Malcolm Greaves and Puan Sri Dr Suraiya Hani Hussein for their vision in introducing a structured Dermatology training programme in Malaysia that we are proud of.

Our Society continues to strive in creating awareness and educating our patients and the general public on skin diseases. One of the projects that PDM had been involved recently was creating a series of webcomics to debunk myths on Atopic Dermatitis and to share the patients' perspective in coping and living with this disease. This series of webcomics was a collaboration with an Eisner Award winner comic artist, Erica Eng, entitled 'Uncover Life' had been uploaded onto our society's website.

Even though we were hindered by the pandemic, PDM had also conducted a Virtual Skin Health Day last year with Sunway University students where our members gave virtual education on Skin Ageing, Managing Atopic Dermatitis and Adolescent Skin Health. With the relaxation of the SOPs we were able to hold a physical National Skin Health Day this year on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2022 at Publika Kuala Lumpur. Similarly, our members in Kuala Lumpur, Penang and Johor had organised various Psoriasis Patient Education workshops working closely with Psoriasis Patients' Advocacy groups. I am truly impressed by the commitment shown by them. Giving back to society is a responsibility we all share.

At this juncture, I would like to take this opportunity in thanking my dedicated Executive Committee members, the Council of Past Presidents, members and chairpersons of the various sub-committees, the dynamic Dermatology Chapter team and our hardworking secretariat for the accomplishments achieved over the past two years. 

# 9<sup>th</sup> Northern Dermatology Summit 2022 HOT TOPICS IN MEDICAL & COSMETIC DERMATOLOGY

# 19<sup>th</sup> - 20<sup>th</sup> February 2022

This is the 9<sup>th</sup> consecutive year we organised the Northern Dermatology Summit (NDS), a collaboration by the Department of Dermatology, Hospital Pulau Pinang, Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah, Hospital Raja Permaisuri Bainun; Malaysian Medical Association (MMA) Penang Branch; Persatuan Dermatologi Malaysia and Dermatology Chapter, Academy of Medicine of Malaysia. Following the enforcement of the Recovery Movement Control, the Malaysian National Security Council (MKN) has set out a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for organising physical conference. This conference adhered strictly to the SOP - wear mask all the time and maintain social distancing. Amid the threat of COVID-19 pandemic, this event was a huge success and attracted a total of 348 participants and 30 pharma exhibitors.

The objective of this course was to introduce a regular continuous medical education programme for both government and private practitioners, with the hope of improving standard of care in Dermatology. The topics chosen are the common dermatological conditions that we encounter in our daily practice and some update on various aspect of Cosmetic and Medical Dermatology.

In the year 2022, with the ease on lockdown, many activities were held physically. After a successful Annual Scientific Meeting, albeit virtually, in early 2021, we were delighted to conduct our 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Scientific Meeting incorporating the Dermatological Society of Malaysia (PDM) Mid-term Meeting from 28<sup>th</sup> - 29<sup>th</sup> May 2022 at Hospital UiTM in Puncak Alam, Selangor. The theme of the event was "New Advances in Dermatology". The Organising Chairman for the event was Dr Henry Foong, Chairman of Dermatology Chapter while the Scientific Chairman was Dr Leong Kin Fon.

This event saw the participation of Associate Professor Dr Alexander Navarini from the Department of Dermatology, University Hospital Basel, Switzerland, as well as Assistant Professor Dr Steven Chen from the Department of Dermatology, Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School, USA who presented virtually during this event. We also invited many talented local dermatologists who spoke on various topics including paediatric dermatology, atopic dermatitis, psoriasis, dermatomycosis, urticaria, acne, maskne, modern wound dressings, cutaneous drug reactions, COVID-19 related adverse events, cosmetic dermatology and hair/nail disorders. We also had a plastic surgeon and a paediatrician to share their expertise at this exciting update. This event was made even more interesting with 11 challenging cases presented by Dermatology Fellows. For the first time, we also had oral presentations of original research, where 11 abstracts were presented. This annual meeting saw a total of 11 symposia, 23 lectures / presentations on Day 1 and another 28 lectures / presentations on Day 2 with 25 speakers involved and 150 delegates.

We also had 28 ePosters from the various hospitals in the country, as well as active participation by the

pharmaceutical companies in the booth exhibition. The event received excellent feedback from the delegates.



# Outreach Programme SINGLE DOSE RIFAMPICIN CHEMOPROPHYLAXIS FOR LEPROSY

The single-dose rifampicin (SDR) chemoprophylaxis programme for leprosy was launched for the first time in Malaysia in Kampung Orang Asli Sawah Batu, Pekan, Pahang on 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> July 2022. It was officiated by Timbalan Pengarah Kesihatan Negeri Pahang (Kesihatan Awam), Dr Husnina binti Ibrahim, and together in attendance were the directors of Hospital Orang Asli Gombak and Hospital Rompin, Head of Dermatological Services of Pahang, Paediatrician from Hospital Pekan, Family Medicine Specialist of PKD Pekan, District Health Officer of Kuantan, District Health Officer of Bera,



District Health Officer of Rompin, District Health Officer of Pekan, TB/Leprosy Unit of JKN Pahang, TB/Leprosy Unit of PKD Pekan, TB/Leprosy Unit of PKD Rompin, Pasukan Bergerak Orang Asli (PBOA) team of Pekan, Vector Unit of PKD Pekan, NCD Unit of PKD Pekan, Dietetics and Nutrition Unit of Pekan, Adolescent Health team of Peramu Jaya Health Clinic, Counseling Unit of PKD Pekan, Health Promotion Unit of Pekan, and Mother and Child Health Unit of PKD Pekan. Out of a total population of 688 individuals in Kampung Orang Asli Sawah Batu, 321 were screened for eligibility for SDR. A total of 273 individuals received SDR chemoprophylaxis, including 17 children below 5 years old and 12 senior citizens. SDR was deferred in 48 individuals (4 declined, 24 suspected leprosy, 7 pregnant women, 3 children below 2 years old, 10 ineligible). No adverse effects to rifampicin were reported among all those who received SDR.

# Humanitarian Dermatology Project REACHING OUT TO THE UNDERSERVED ABORIGINAL POPULATION OF GOMBAK

This is a project with an aim to reach out to the underserved aboriginal population of Gombak, led by Dr Henry Foong, Chairman of Dermatology Chapter, Dr Leong Kin Fon, Scientific Chairman and Dr Izandis, Pengarah Hospital Orang Asli Gombak.

In collaboration with the medical team of Hospital Orang Asli Gombak, Committee Members of the Dermatology Chapter (who are all fellow consultant dermatologists at their respective hospitals) visit the hospital on a two monthly basis to facilitate the management of dermatological conditions.

A focused programme of bedside teaching is conducted as this is believed to be a core element of building confidence and expertise in clinical assessment and judgement. Our visiting consultant dermatologists also run the CME (Continuing Medical Education) programme, with the aim of closing the gaps in knowledge. Store and forward teledermatology services have also been set up for the closed group to provide dermatologic care in between visits and follow ups.

The major challenges for handling dermatology conditions among the aborigines are financial and resource constraints for the local health service. Infectious diseases such as cutaneous fungal infection are highly prevalent in the indigenous population. Treatment of such infections and infestations may also require treating the family members, so as to avoid reinfection. However follow-up visits are sometimes difficult to provide for aborigines and hence we partner with the primary care providers to establish longitudinal community based dermatology clinics for these populations.

# Remembrance of **DR CHU SIEW MUN**

The Dermatology Community is greatly saddened by the recent demise of one of our senior colleagues, Dr Chu Siew Mun.

In 1964 he joined the pioneer batch of students at the medical faculty of the Universiti Malaya and graduated in 1969. He then proceeded to obtain his MRCP in 1974 and also the Diploma in Dermatology from St John's Institute of Dermatology. He served as a lecturer at the Universiti Malaya from 1973 to 1977. He then left for private practice in his own clinic as well as at Assunta Hospital and later Subang Jaya Medical Centre.

Dr Chu was active in many social organisations as well the Dermatological Society of Malaysia (PDM). He was the President of the PDM from 1973 to 1977. He was also the Independent Non-Executive Director of Esthetics International Group Bhd, a skin care company, since 2008. He had musical talent coupled with determination too. Rather late in life, after having worked as a busy doctor for many years, he somehow managed to learn to play the organ really well and was an organist at many society and social functions.

In his lifetime, Dr Chu had a busy and successful dermatology practice and was well regarded for his excellent clinical skills. Above this, his college mates, colleagues and friends all fondly remember him as an unassuming, soft-spoken, kind, gentle and sincere person.
